


Forest research win

National institute funds expected for Mount Gambier in state budget

THE proposed multi-million-dollar national Mount Gambier forestry research centre is starting to gain momentum with State Government funding expected to be announced in the state budget next week.

It is understood the government has confirmed the windfall at a federal departmental level, but Forestry Minister Leon Bignell yesterday remained tight-lipped on the matter.

If the speculation is correct, the decision is a major backflip by Mr Bignell, who ruled out funding the project just three months ago.

The Mount Gambier centre of the National Institute for Forest Products Innovation was a key

election commitment by Member for Barker Tony Pasin.

The research centre - one of two proposed in Australia - is expected to drive cutting edge research into softwood plantations and processing.

Mr Bignell's office yesterday told The Border Watch the minister could not comment on "budget initiatives".

According to Mr Pasin yesterday, the project - which has received \$2m from Federal Government coffers was steadily progressing with an agreement brokered to house the institute in the University of SA Mount Gambier campus.
